Validation of prior learning process at VIA

- VIA University College is one of Denmark's largest institutions of Higher Education. One of 6 Profession Highschools in Denmark. There are approximately 20000 annual students at VIA UC.
- VIA has several VPL teams. Every team has responsibility for one or more educational programs. VIA prepares common framework conditions and descriptions, but each team has a lot of autonomy
- > To secure the rights of the applicant and to seek objectivity of the validation, we are always two validators on each task.
- All assessors are also counselors, and most of them have a master's degree in Guidance.

The VPL Process divided into four steps

- The applicant sends in an application form, which includes a description of previously obtained qualifications such as educational diplomas, professionally relevant courses, and work experiences. It also contains a motivated application.
- 2. The recognition process begins by reading the application, and the first deselection and categorization take place.
- 3. The VPL interview takes place.
- 4. The final assessment takes place. Approximately 40% gets approval and, therefore, a positive validation of prior learning.

Changing the procedure

- The Interview is based on an academic article with significant professional relevance
- > The case story
- Investigation shows that preceding procedures focusing on interviews based on professional academic articles followed by a professional argumentation, favor ethnic applicants.

Narratives as a way to recognition of competence

- > The importance of bringing narrative into the VPL process
- The use of pictures as a starting point for every VPL interview
- A photograph always holds more than the individual immediately can see; it is not possible to exhaust a photo for meaning during a VPL conversation. Any picture will leave blank spaces in the image that the viewer will fill in
- The applicant is both the author and the editor of the story, and can relate to the story and the topics it produces
- > the images provide a common ground between applicant and assessor

The important factors

- three particular factors have identified themselves as important for whether an applicant can later complete a higher education, namely: robustness, persistence, and problem-solving ability
- Applicants manage to form transfers between very diverse arenas.
